- 1. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS:
 - a. Approve agenda- all approved
 - b. Additional topics for discussion- Circle the Bay Marathon: Thomas talked to Melissa Cribbens and she provided the contact to road department. Thomas will reach out to them and get started with organizing. The idea is to flip the course, shut the Bridge down for the start (15 minutes). Bring the race into Coos Bay at the museum try to have 1 lane closed and bring the event back on the same lane OR do a road crossing as usual and finish by coming under the bridge. Work on sanctioning for a Boston Qualifier, reach out to running companies in Eugene for tips. Lots of potential for bringing tourism. Patrick Meyer will own the food on the course. He will survey the club and find out what he needs. Need aid stations for the stops. Start advertising at Circle the Bay. 2019 goal.
 - c. Grant Request- BAH approved and awarded \$900. Todd Landsberg to sponsor the business portion of the budget. Run of Two cities and Mac's run funds = 125, Thomas Lankford to member sponsorship of \$25. Work on thank-you to BAH. Need to add BAH as a sponsor to the website and promote them at every event.
 - d. Timing Device-2019 goal. Target price is 5,995. Program through ACTIVE. 2000 participants, 1 reader, 3 total mats (start, 2- mats for the splits. Power supply, cords, cables). Thomas shared that the program is basic software and runs itself. Only barrier to use are runs are have remote service and limited electricity (Sunset and MACS Run). Can use an extension cord Patrick Meyer suggested requesting another BAH Grant for next year. Patrick Meyer will donate \$500 towards the timing device.
